#### **MYSTERY CAR**

You may remember in the last edition (November) of the newsletter, Peter Hine provided this teaser for our occasional mystery car section. I'm pleased

to report that I received two suggestions as to the identity of the car.

The first came from Geoff Fry who thinks it is a Buckler

and the second from Ken Scott who has put his shirt on a Dellow.



**Geoff's** suggestion came without any supporting information. So referring to my edition of Gregor Grant's British Sport Cars, I found **Buckler**, which included the following....

"The Buckler Cars company was founded by Derek Buckler and based in Reading. Around 500 cars were produced between 1947 and 1962. The basis of the design is a cleverly-designed, multi-tubular frame, to which can be fitted various Ford components, including axles, wheels and brakes. They are usually powered by Buckler modified Ford Ten engines and fitted with Buckler close-ratio gears."

**Ken's** suggestion of a **Dellow** is also featured in Gregor Grant's book, but Ken provided the following information.

The car is a Dellow Mk. 2. The Dellow was a car built specially for trials and 'mud-plugging' hill climbs. Built near Birmingham in the 1950's originally around the Austin 7 but subsequently around the Ford E93A side-valve cars. The Ford beam axle with transverse leaf spring and telescopic dampers giving amazing articulation for 'off road' use. Around 300 were believed to have been built.

Both cars are similar in concept, built in the immediate post war period using Ford parts and designed to be multi-purpose machines used in hill-climbs and speed events as well as trials and rallies. I'll leave **Peter** to arbitrate based on the information he has - Good luck!
