How to Accommodate a West Highland Terrier in a MGB Roadster

Our rescue Westie is of the opinion that she must always accompany us any time the classic car is taken out, to the point that whenever she hears the engine start-up she races to the door with goggles and scarf ready for the off. The same thought process applied when we had the TD which did not present a problem as there was adequate room in the back.

However, when we decided to acquire an MGB Roadster last December it



occurred to me that perhaps it would be wise to check the dimensions of the area aft of the seats, so I carefully measured the dog's inside leg, waist, height etc. using a neighbours "B" as the trial vehicle. These simple checks confirmed that the accommodation area behind the seats would be more than adequate and a few days later we carried out a full trial with Mille the dog in position in the newly purchased vehicle.

The huge forts are interesting but I love getting into the woods and finding shrapnel and barbed wire and exploring bunkers with torches. Do any of you know the story of the Lost

Battalion (made into a movie of the same title)? It is the story of an American unit that got completely cut off and surrounded on a steep hillside - one of the highlights this year was tracking down the spot and even finding a piece of shrapnel there.

We have been buying up various WW1 goodies from some of the small museums but we have now found that French boot sales are the place to go - we couldn't carry any more and we were buying for a tenth of the price! We bought brass shell cases, bayonets, water bottles and all sorts all for a Euro or two each! Verdun is great - it has French and America stories but it has so much in the way of trenches and bunkers - the Somme is a disappointment now with so much returned to perfect farmland. In contrast the miles of trenches at Verdun are too much to take in!

Anyway I had to buy some wine and chocolate on the way home so Nancy didn't get too cross with my two box loads of souvenirs!
