Whilst at present we seem to be in the rainy season, let's hope that we do not get really wintery weather in the next few weeks.


For those who have not yet booked for the club spring break on the Gower Coast there are still two rooms available on reserve at the hotel.

End of an ERA Paul Warn

Morgan will this year end production of its models built on the simple steel ladder-frame chassis - top right - a system it introduced in 1936 with its first four-wheeled model, called the 4/4.

The story goes that in recognition of modern customers' need for greater road ability, even in traditional sports cars, the company plans to replace the outgoing models - the 4/4, Plus 4 and Roadster - with "a range of models" that will utilise versions of the light and rigid CX-generation chassis - top left - it introduced with the Plus Six last year.

"We recognise a need for a more resolved core product that meets both our customers' needs and future legislative requirements," said Morgan CEO Steve Morris. "The advanced engineering of the new platform is a vital underpinning for the next generation of Morgan sports cars."

The chassis decision is part of a suite of changes and improvements that follow the purchase of the Malvern Link sports car company by Invest industrial, an Italian private equity firm that is also a major shareholder in Aston Martin.

Developments include the opening in a few weeks of a modern and extremely spacious engineering and development centre (dubbed M-DEC, for Morgan Design and Engineering Centre) on a new site close to its Pickersleigh Road base.

"We need space to work on new projects," said chief designer Jon Wells. "It has to be away from the suppliers and visitors who visit us nearly every day," added Morris. "So we've made it close, but separate."

Work is also about to begin on a major refurbishment of the Pickersleigh Road visitors' centre, which annually greets 30,000 people, each of whom pays £24 for an expertly guided two-hour

tour. Tours will recommence in March, and the new, improved centre will be back in action by spring next year.

For now, Morgan is extremely secretive about the exact specification of its forthcoming new models, though it is believed most will maintain Morgan's classic look. More details are likely to be available in March at the Geneva motor show, which the company traditionally attends.

This year's offerings are understood to include a model priced below the Plus Six's £77,995, powered by a four-cylinder turbocharged engine - whose supplier is still secret - and mated to a manual gearbox. Company insiders confirm that the new car will be launched later this year, though they won't yet specify date, name or price range.

The performance and all-round capability of the Plus Six has proved so good that Morgan bosses regard it as a spiritual successor for the potent Plus 8 of former times, rather than the V6 Roadster.



Coincident with the demise of the Plus 4, 2020 marks the 70th anniversary of the Plus 4. The Plus 4 at its introduction in 1950, was fitted with a 2088cc Standard Vanguard engine installed on a strengthened 4/4 chassis with a wheelbase lengthened by 4 in (102 mm). Hydraulic brakes, at first all drum, were fitted for the first time on a Morgan.



Seventy years later, Morgan will mark the cessation of the production of the Plus 4 by building a batch of 20 commemorative models, based on the current architecture. The 70th Anniversary Edition gains a more powerful engine in addition to a long list of specific visual tweaks inside and out. All 20 commemorative models were sold before the build was publicly announced.

A Question Posed by Roger Binney

We have such a lot of knowledge within the group, I wonder if we have a view on why our car industry has been lost whilst other European countries have thrived. VW, Mercedes, BMW, Volvo, Fiat, Peugeot, Renault, Citroen etc.

We as a nation are supposed to be good at business, trading, engineering, innovation.. so why have we failed? In the light of "all the new opportunities which will arise out of Brexit" there could be some valuable insights.

I suggest the question is posed this month and summarise responses into a future article.?

A Response from Malcolm Taylor

Why limit it to the demise of the car industry? What about the demise of all industry? Two major factors are involved, 'Bad Management' and 'Control by Accountants.'

Basically management is responsible for everything. If the unions gain the upper hand (1970's) Management has failed. Our industrial relations are generally confrontational. Management is generally middle or upper class, doing battle with the workers, seen as left wing reactionary. In Germany for instance there is a lot more cooperation between management and the unions. A successful company means more for the workers to share in.

If outside influences are the cause of problems, Management has failed to foresee and react quickly and effectively.

It's too easy to blame the workers. Nissan and Honda produce in this country at as good or better rates than in Japan. Although Honda are soon to leave.

On the accountancy front, it is shortsightedness. Don't look any further than the end of your nose. If you can't get a return on your capital tomorrow, forget it. Or they take control of something that is in trouble and re-organise it to fit a particular financial mould and flick it on for a profit.

The Japanese are the past masters at the long term view. They go into a market and subsidise and undercut the opposition till they go out of business. Then they reap the reward of their long term view.

A story that springs to mind is Count Agusta. He controlled practically all of the motorcycle industry in Italy. He told the Italian government to keep the Japanese out. They said they couldn't because of EU rules. He said, if they come in they will gradually put all of my workers out of a job. Find a way to keep them out or I will shut all my factories and put the workers out of a job now. Italy still has a motorcycle industry.

With a few exceptions, we do not have the equivalent to the German Mittelstand. Which is middle ranking, usually family owned companies with a long term view. Mittelstand are generally seen to encompass the following:-

Family ownership or family-like corporate culture

- *Generational continuity
- *Long-term focus
- Independence
- *Nimbleness
- Emotional attachment
- *Investment into the workforce
- •Flexibility
- *Lean hierarchies
- Innovativeness
- *Customer focus
- Social responsibility
- Strong regional ties

The exceptions here that spring to mind are, Morgan, JCB, Triumph, Dyson.

Triumph is a good example of a long term passion beats the accountants. Bloor made his money building houses. He had a dream of resurrecting Triumph. No accountant would have countenanced the idea. He bought the rights to the name and logo and then started spending his own money. He spent £6 million before he saw a penny back. Thats not profit, thats the first sale. And that was a good while ago. I don't know what that would be at todays rates.

Added to which we are a very open business nation. We will let anyone in and sell our businesses to anyone. Witness foreign ownership of our utilities. They are a licence to print money and the profit goes out of the country.

Foreign state owned businesses running our transport firms.

I warned you not to get me started.

It was the arrangement of the instruments in front of the driver. The speedometer was out of the way with the rev counter taking prime position. The rev counter was also orientated in such a way as to make the red line appear at the 12 o'clock position. The reason? This MG is used for hill climbs, and the most important information for the driver is when the engine is at it's limit. There is even a red light directly above it which illuminates if you haven't spotted the needle creeping too high. I found that quite interesting!

boyfriend introduced me to the online MOT and advisory list check available from the DVLA with just the registration. https://www.gov.uk/check-mot-history

This service tells you what a car has failed on over previous years and what the advisories were - you get to see the minor issues develop into serious ones - normally involving subframe corrosion for MGTFs. As soon as I did this for the cars on Ebay my whole attitude changed - these shiny cars were not the bargain they looked like..... money pits all! Unless you fluke it basically you won't get a decent MGTF for under £3000. Don't even bother looking at the ones around the £1000 mark! This DVLA service though is amazing and I strongly suggest you all try it if you are buying a second hand car -it is quick and easy and would give you a good bargaining edge if you still wanted the car after checking.

Good luck you car buyers! I am not in the market as I am now sober....
