popular entry in the club's diary is the annual Spring Tour, which this year courtesy of Gordon and Sandra Newman took us to the Roundabout Hotel in West Chiltington between Pulborough and Storrington in West Sussex. Ah I hear you say a hotel on a roundabout?

First a little history...

One Reginald Fairfax Wells trained as a sculpture at the Royal College of Art in the late 1890s and gained a reputation for fine bronzes and English pottery. In 1925 he moved to the Storrington area with a dream of creating "the perfect English Village". He built more than 30 cottages in an estate that became known as the Roundabouts - an English term for a spinner which is a thicket with underwood. The cottages on the estate were designed to look centuries old, our hotel was one of these cottages.

The county is quite familiar to us as we visit the Goodwood racing events two or tree times a year. In fact only the week before this visit we attended the 80th Goodwood Members Meeting - separate story.

Gordon and Sandra provided a very comprehensive travel pack for our collective use throughout the visit.

Anne and I travelled down to West Sussex via Hinton Ampner where we stopped to have a coffee and cake - as you do - in the grounds of the National Trust house. The theme of this weekend was going to be tulips as of course April is the season for tulips. The gardens were full of these lovely flowers and of all types. Our next stop en route was to be Parham House and Gardens one of the country's finest Elizabethan houses set in the foot of the South Downs and too far from our destination. In addition to the tulips in the formal gardens there were also hundreds of bluebells and daffodils in amongst the blossoming trees around the grounds.

We arrived at our destination at around 4:00pm with plenty of time to settle into our very comfortable suite. The routine then for the weekend was to meet in the bar for around 7:00pm before a 7:30pm supper and a chance to catch up with everyone and swap stories.

We had two full days to explore the area and generally we all visited the same places but at different times, including the nearby coast. On Saturday we all seemed to descend on Arundel Castle - a restored and remodelled medieval castle established in the reign of Edward the Confessor. We have visited many places in our time not only in this country but in Europe - Arundel Castle is on a magnificent scale. And yes tulips were involved!

In fact the tulip festival was billed as the largest display of tulips in Europe and according to the Head Gardener this year's Tulip Festival featured 70,000 new tulips and over 130 different named tulips planted throughout the castle gardens and grounds. Apparently the castle boasts the world's first ever tulip & narcissi labyrinth, planted up with white Thalia Narcissi and the later flowering red Kingsblood tulips. Do I sound as if I know what I'm talking about!

Afterwards we walked around the town and I picked up some Automobila in the antique shops.

We were greeted with rain on Sunday morning - National Drive It Day and of course St George's Day. Following breakfast and a few pics of the cars we made our way to West Dean Gardens just north of Chichester. We didn't need our brolly although we did carry it around the gardens - just in case - on a nice gentle walk.

West Dean is a nineteenth century Gothic house, designed by James Wyatt with a twentieth century Arts and Crafts garden, designed by Harold Peto in 1911. Edward James, who lived here, was a patron of surrealist art. The great feature of West Dean Gardens is a 300' stone pergola with timber beams - part of which is being restored. Following a good lunch, we made our way to Goodwood House for a mooch around. The grounds look a lot different without the paraphernalia of the Festival of Speed cluttering up the Duke's extensive estate. Although we have taken the tour around the house a few times before, it's usually with a different guide each time and a different

By mid afternoon the sun was shining and we were on tender hooks waiting for our mobile phone to announce the test of the 'National Emergency Alert'. With that over and done with, we made our way back in the direction of the hotel.

The weekend past very quickly and come Monday morning it was time to make tracks for home. 

Manor Road Garage, East Preston, Angmering, was I believe originally opened in the early 1920's, so there is a slight connection with the MG Centenary, and the art deco frontage was added in the 1930's.

This was a working garage with petrol pumps until 1973 and then closed and fell into disrepair and was fenced off until in either 2007 or 2008 the garage workshops were cleared and according to rumour a number of older MG and other premium cars were removed.

The building was then sold and the rear workshops were demolished and rebuilt ato become luxury apartments.

The original 1930's façade and the original 1950's Shell Petrol Pumps have all been restored, but obviously no longer work and are purely decorative, and the frontage and petrol pumps are both Grade 2 listed.

ANOTHER OPPORTUNITY TO OWN A GREAT CLASSIC CAR...THIS TIME TOM STRICKLAND'S MG MAGNETTE.

1958 MG Magnette Baritone £8,000

1958 was the last year of these Magnettes - this one therefore has the two-toned paintwork, the larger rear window and the better geared rear diff.

This car was bought new from Bristol by an officer in the Royal Air Force (The original dealer sticker is still visible on the dashboard). The RAF officer kept the car, and it was garaged when he became too old to drive it. Apart from being rescued by a local mechanic the car essentially had one owner before me. I bought the car in 2009. The car should be steel and mineral blue, but at some point, the top was repainted in grey (I have a tin of the correct paint should a prospective owner wish to return it to the correct colour).

The car was very original when I took it on and the first job, I had done was to restore the bodywork - this included new sills, work to the front valence, wings and door bottoms and a respray of the bottom half of the car. Following this I redid the door seals, carpets and addressed the lighting so that the car would have clearly visible indicators. I also cleaned off the bottom of the car and painted it with POR Rust Preventative Paint system and injected the cavities with Dynax S50 (The Original owner had regularly poured oil into the box sections of the chassis)

Since then, I have steadily improved the car. Here are some of the bigger jobs I have done:

- Proper seatbelts
- Stainless exhaust.
- The Head gasket and water pump
- Brakes were overhauled with new flexipipes
- Clutch Hydraulics replaced including Master cylinder.
- The Radiator was refurbished.
- Conversion to negative Earth including adding an Alternator.
- Hi-Gear supplied reconditioned Ford Sierra Type 9 Gearbox
- Discreet 'behind dash' Blue tooth Sound system
- Carburettors overhauled.
- Front Suspension rebuilt using Poly bushes (modern rubber doesn't last!)
- Speedo repaired and geared to suit the new gearbox still doesn't blinking work though!
- Electronic ignition
- Isofix child car seat fittings added discreetly into the rear seat.

Virtually all parts are still available and reasonably prices (http://www.mgspecs.co.uk/)

The car is owned by myself, and I have been a long-term member of the various MG Clubs and am currently Club Secretary to the 0716 Wessex MG Club. I currently own several other MGs and as the children have grown up I have found that the Magnette is used less and less and so should now find a new home. The car won the Pride of Ownership at the MG International Show and Spares Day in 2011 which led on to the car being featured in MG Enthusiast Magazine in June 2011. The car lives is a Veloce Carcoon inside my garage (This is the framed 'drive in/out' type) and the system also acts as a battery conditioner. The Car is not perfect and wouldn't win a concours competition - There are a few jobs to give a new owner small easy projects continuing from where I have go to. An example would be that the car would benefit from having the quarterlight window seals changed.

The car has Footman James agreed Valuation of £10,000

Secretary's Scribbles

This month I started to use the TF more again and I have also added a remote boot release. The TF is an unusual car in that to open the boot you have to use the key there is no button. I have therefore taken a power supply through and wired up a simple ebay solenoid kit and hey presto I can now open the boot get stuff in and out without having to turn off the engine and use my key. I find this very useful as I want to unload the boot before putting her away in the garage for example. My next job will be to wire up a ctek battery conditioner socket in a

decent location so I don't need to open the bonnet each time I get home - remember that in a TF you have to open the boot to get at the bonnet opening catch... I still need to work on the seat bolts so that I can finish off the red T Bar trim and possibly swap over my donor red seats (not sure on these yet).

I have included an advert for the Magnette to Paul so that club members can have an opportunity to consider the car before she goes on sale to the public.
