There is an MG100 event in Abingdon on Sunday September 10th and I am planning to be there, details are elsewhere in the newsletter for those who may also wish to go.


Our club Skittles Match should take place during October and I am awaiting confirmation of date from the venue.

There is always an element of jeopardy when organising an outdoor event particularly given the unpredictability of our summers - and this year was, well, no exception. And then onto a tranquil walk around the lake and the main attraction. Here the work was affordable if you were to sell your Ferrari...A wonderful day out and well worth another visit.









alking of sculptures, most of you will be familiar with the themed sculptures in front of Goodwood House for the annual Festival of Speed. Usually there is a featured manufacturer - eg one with a big anniversary, last year it was BMW as seen above or the sculpture might represent a theme for that year's event. Whatever the reason the cars on those stalks are real cars not mock-ups and often

important historic cars telling a story. The artist is Gerry Judah and the fabrication of the sculpture is carried out by Littlehampton Welding Ltd.

Under the grass at the base are permanently installed concrete blocks weighing 30 tonnes and the base of the sculpture weighs in at 16-odd tonnes.

The one proviso to qualify for this elevated status is that all fluids must be drained and the engine removed. I mentioned the cost of the exhibits at Pallington Lakes, here apart from the value of the cars included on the sculpture you will need to find circa £1M.

Wessex MG Club Great War Battlefield Trip 2024

Dear All,

I am proposing the opportunity for a Great War Battlefield Trip in the first week of my Easter Holidays (1st April – 7th April 2024).

The Key Features would probably be:

- Three Day tour (in the date window above)
- The Battlefields of the Somme, Arras and Ypres
- Professionally guided and led by Tom Strickland
- Self-Drive in your car But we keep together on a set route
- Tour pack with maps and details provided by Tom
- Two nights' accommodation with evening meals and maybe packed lunches TBC (The first night probably on the Somme and the second in Ypres)
- Insurance included
- Eurotunnel included
- Museum entrance included

So, this would be a proper organised tour on a set route and itinerary. There would of course be some extras you would need such as European Breakdown cover and getting yourselves kitted out for European motoring, which I would support you with. You may also wish to get a cheap hotel the night before we go -I am trying to maximise the time we are touring on the Battlefields.

My First thoughts to an itinerary are:

Essex Farm (The Start of the poppy story) Langermarck German Cemetery Menin Gate Ceremony 	 Menin Gate in the Daylight Tyne Cot Cemetery Passchendaele Museum Late PM Eurotunnel

The sites would be given context and stories by Tom on the ground. We would in a few places use Media to watch original footage filmed at the locations during the battle.

If you have family links to any sites or cemeteries, these can possibly be included (and I am keen to do this) if you let me know in advance and they do not affect the timings too much.

THE COST IS TOTALLY DEPENDENT ON NUMBERS so to start with I am looking for expression of interest – this will then move to deposits in a few weeks time.

The Big news though is the story of my 'romantic' trip to Mons and the Great Retreat in the TF. Eurotunnel and the European Breakdown people to adjust everything from the passenger seat. Luckily all then went fine - we had to pay a little more for a larger vehicle on the Eurotunnel and a different time slot and we also managed a refund for a younger vehicle on the breakdown which nearly evened everything out financially.

We had three great days touring Belgium and France looking at the famous sites associated with the Battle of Mons and the Great Retreat of August 1914. We even jumped on a train at Complegne to have a day in Paris too. The ZS was actually a near perfect touring car with plenty of space and cruise control for the French Autoroutes (However we did miss the aircon, which is currently not working ..) The unexpected big bonus was that we could fit more beer and wine in on the way home

It won't be long before it is MGs in Tom and Nancy's field so get practising your reversing.
