
The Way It Was

1964 MGB BMC Works Sebring 12 hours

f you had motored up to The Classic Motor Hub recently you would have come across this fabulous BMC works MGB.

This was one of three MGBs - one red, one white and one blue - that had been entered for the 1964 Sebring 12 Hours endurance classic by Kjell Qvale, a West Coast BMC distributor based in San Francisco. His competition department was run by Joe Huffaker, who prepared the three cars with upgraded parts that had been sent over by the MG Competition Department in Abingdon.

The red car was based on a very early MGB - body number 000114. Originally shipped to the US in July 1962, it had incurred salt-water damage in transit and couldn't be sold, so Qvale decided that it would make the ideal basis for a race car.

While overall victory went to a Ferrari, this MGB crossed the line 3rd in class.





2024 Festival of Speed

n my email asking for content for the July edition I mentioned that we were travelling down to Goodwood for the Festival of Speed this weekend, in the hope that we didn't have a repeat of last year's weather. As you can see from the title photo, all was good!

On arrival however the first thing we noticed when we were approaching the members' enclosure was the absence of multi-storey temporary buildings erected by the car manufacturers to showcase their new models. It was the threat of these massive structures being blown down in last year's high winds that caused the event on the Saturday to be cancelled.

The central feature outside Goodwood House this year celebrated the centenary of MG founded as you will all know by Cecil Kimber in 1924. There is a strong and enduring bond between Goodwood and MG. The current Duke of Richmond's grandfather, Freddy March managed a team of MGs, securing victory - amongst others - in the 1931 Brooklands Double Twelve alongside Chris Staniland in an MG C-Type. It was Freddy March who established the Goodwood racing circuit from 1948 to 1966 and revived in 1998 by the current Duke.

This year's feature captures part of MGs history. On the left is the MGB symbolising MGs storied past and on the right symbolising the future, the new MG Cyberster - both full size proper cars.
