Wessex 4×4 Response is a Registered Charity comprising unpaid volunteers dedicated to providing emergency logistics for the Category 1 & 2 organisations, in support of our communities. We operate within the Avon & Somerset, Dorset and Wiltshire & Swindon Police forces' areas. Our liaison team is active within the Local Resilience Forum in each force area and we can also support other regions under mutual aid.

Through the use of our volunteers' own 4×4 vehicles, we can provide those logistics regardless of weather, ground conditions and location. We have included some examples below.

Assist Police

Our partnership with the police enables their experts to focus on their vital roles during major incidents.

Support health and care sector

Providing essential transport for health and care professionals and their equipment during severe weather conditions.

Provide disaster response

e.g. In severe flooding, we aid in evacuations, transport key workers, deliver supplies, and assist with road closures.



Ye always encouraged new members to at least provide a photo of their classic MG for inclusion in the newsletter by way of an introduction into the club and as an added bonus, support their photo with a few words on their car and how they became interested in the MG marque.

Now, although both Peter Hine and I are long standing members of the club and have owned Morgans for some years - Peter longer than I - we have been somewhat reticent to do as bidded incase we are stoned at our next event! To be fair there is good hearted banter within the club and as I have pointed out on many occasions there is MORGAN in the name! However at the end of the day, we are 5th columnists within the club and potential disruptors...

So what is this about? Well we have both changed our Morgans recently and I was asked at the AGM to include a piece in the newsletter about my Morgan and by extension Peter's.

We both have had Plus 4 Morgans as I have said for some years with the Ford 2 litre Duratec engine mated in my case to a Mazda MX5 gearbox. Now without conferring, in Septemberish last year we both changed our cars - Peter sourced a Morgan Plus Six and I a Morgan Pus Four. (In the latter note the difference in the name from Plus 4 to Four. Both my Plus four and Peter's Plus Six are of the new generation CX design - the biggest evolution in design in Morgan's history. In July 2020 following an 84 year production run, the Morgan Motor Company had built its last four wheeled car on a traditional steel framed ladder chassis, the end of an era for the company. - see **photo 1**. No more sliding pillar front suspension to keep topped-up with grease every 500 or so miles. In total 35,000 four-wheeled Morgan cars with the steel chassis have been made and exported to 65 countries around the world.

Morgan's current range of four-wheeled cars the Plus Four and Plus Six are based on a bonded aluminium CX-generation platform - see **photo 2** - Why CX? When the CX design was launched in 2019 it was 110 years since Morgan was founded in 1909 hence the Roman numeral nomenclature CX (110).

Oh and in passing, the new design retains the wooden ash frame for which Morgan is famous for. It's used to create a solid framework around the cockpit - see **photos 3 and 4 -** over which the aluminium panels are attached.

Enough of the background now a little about our Morgans. Both our cars use the same CX structure and suspension, the Plus Four suspension is modified to give a 79mm narrower track ie the wishbone suspension arms are shorter and splined hubs are fitted suitable for wire wheels - the Plus Six doesn't have wire wheels. See **photo 5** for a comparison in size of the two cars. I took this pic whilst at the Morgan dealer in Bedfordshire, I looked at the Plus 6 on the left and the black Plus Four on the right eventually choosing the Plus Four.

The engine in the 'Four is the BMW B48 TwinPower Turbo - the four cylinder version of the Plus 6's B58 six cylinder unit. These are part of a modular engine family with three, four and six-cylinder versions with 500cc capacity per cylinder. Both the Morgan engines have Twin Scroll Turbochargers.

Plus Four top speed 149mph	0-62 mph 5.2 secs.
Plus Six top speed 166mph	0-62 mph 4.2 secs

Peter's Plus 6 has an 8 speed auto gearbox My Plus Four a 6 speed manual box

With the chassis being fundamentally the same the cockpit and seats are the same on both models ie more room than in our old model Plus 4s.

All the interior and electronic features are the same on both cars ie remote locking, LED daytime running lights automatic headlights, puddle lighting, ABS, power steering and they both share the same digital dashboard system. The aluminium body panels are made at the Superform factory in Worcester as are the panels for Aston Martin, Bentley and Rolls Royce. The process starts with CAD

representations of stresses and thickness, this is used in the production of the male and female moulds. The sheets of aluminium at 500 degrees centigrade are 'blown' into the mould. When cool they are laser cut to size.

All Morgans have unique characteristics which are specified by the customer when being built, as I did when my last Morgan was built in late 2011.


Peter's Plus Six specifically is one of 50 'special editions' produced in Bentley emerald green with the numbers etc. to celebrate the launch of the model. Peter's is chassis build #87 and as far as Peter can tell, there are less than 200 Plus Six's registered in the UK which won't be going up as they have stopped production now. And in Peter's words it's stupidly quick...



My Plus Four was specified in black, with black tipped exhaust pipes, Black Accent Pack, black Grille and Mesh, spot lamps and bespoke stainless engine-turned dash panels.
